

## Colour match

ELG: Mathematics: It is important that children develop positive attitudes and interests in mathematics, look for patterns and relationships, spot connections, 'have a go', talk to adults and peers about what they notice and not be afraid to make mistake.

### You are your child's teacher:

Use descriptive language: talk about what colour your child likes avoid asking questions.

Use a range of vocabulary and introduce new words.

Talk about different textures.

Be warm, supportive, and encouraging.

You could use socks to create a colour matching game.

You might want to use cardboard boxes to separate the colours, so you could have a box for white socks, a box for red socks and a box for black socks.



You could create a colour wheel that you can spin then once it lands on a colour you and your child could look around you house to find
