Easter Egg wreath

You will need:

- Paper or card
- Crayons or felt tip pens
- Glue
- Ribbon or string

Cut your paper/ card into an egg shape and let your child decorate the egg, cut out a circle and remove the centre to create the wreath. Once the eggs have been decorated stick them onto the wreath, add the ribbon or string to hang your wreath up.
