

Outdoor Fun Activities with Natural objects

Early Learning Goal: physical development: Fine motor: use a range of small tools

You are your child's teacher:

Talk about what your child is doing helps their language to develop by learning new words.

Giving them lots of different activities to explore will help develop their physical skills.

Set simple goals your child can achieve.

Give your child time to think and reply.

Be warm, supportive, and encouraging.

Nature Mobile:

Have a nature treasure hunt to collect interesting things like cones, acorns, leaves, flowers, twigs, stones. Make sure you also get one larger twig or branch.

You'll need some string and scissors to cut it a different lengths.

Use the treasures you've collected to create your nature mobile by tying them on to the string, then on to the larger twig.



Nature crown:

You will need cardboard or paper to make the crown shape.

Make sure it fits your head before you start sticking things on it.

You'll need double sided tape to stick the leaves and flowers to decorate your crown.

Bark rubbing:

You will need: Wax crayons, paper and a tree!

Place your paper onto the tree and rub your crayon on the paper to discover the pattern the bark makes.
