Use descriptive language say what you see.

Avoid asking questions.

Listen to your child.

Let your child read you a story.

Be warm, supportive, and encouraging.

Singing and Rhymes:

Repeating songs, rhymes and stories helps your child to have a vibrant imagination. Helps your child with language, memory, thinking skills, problem solving and concentration. Action songs and rhymes boosts your child's physical motor skills and develops rhythm and movement.
