

# Types of High Needs SEND Funding for Individual Students in Nottinghamshire Mainstream Schools

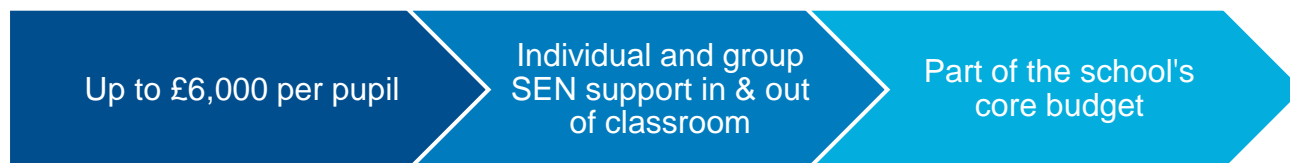
The information below shows the high needs funding that is available annually for mainstream school pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) in Nottinghamshire, without the need for an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Allocations are made per pupil, per school or per group of schools, based on individual level of need, in line with the [UK National High needs funding: 2025 to 2026 operational guide](#). Some elements of funding can provide whole-school and group support that individual pupils then access, while other elements of funding can provide direct support for individual pupils with higher levels of need. A school's overall budget also provides support for quality-first teaching and inclusive provision for all children with SEND, as part of the school's core function.



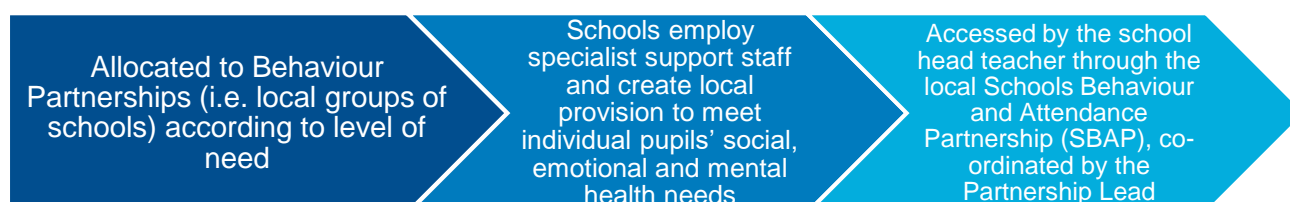
## Element 1: Core School Funding

### Notional SEND Budget

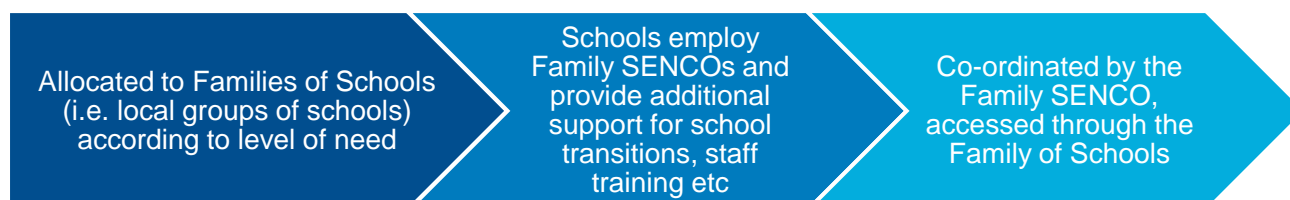


## Element 2: High Needs Top-up Funding

### Family Needs Funding (FNF) (£1.5 million 2025/2026 Budget)

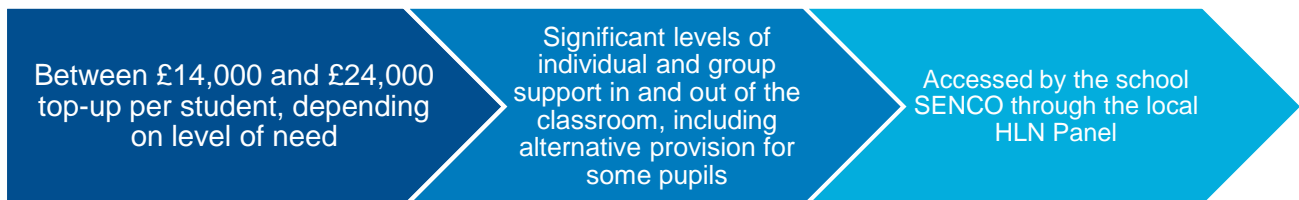


## Additional Family of Schools Need (AFN) (£14 million 2025/2026 Budget)
