Technology Enabled Care provided by Nottinghamshire County Council

Monitors and alarms can detect if there is an emergency and alert a carer or support centre. You must be eligible for care and support, and Nottinghamshire County Council then can supply four types of systems depending on your personal circumstances.

Services: Telecare, Standalone Technology Enabled Care, and Activity Monitoring

Care and Support Assessment by Nottinghamshire County Council

Care and support assessment can be completed over the phone, at a clinic, or during a visit at your home by one of Nottinghamshire County Council's workers.

You can also ask for an assessment form to be sent to you, so you can fill it in and return it to the council.

Nottingham City Council Adult Social Care Team helps people with difficulty doing daily activities such as washing, cooking and getting dressed. If you or someone you know needs this type of help, you can get a Care Needs Assessment from Nottingham City Council. This assessment will help you to receive the social care support you need. You can ask your GP, carer, social services or district nurse to refer you to the Nottingham City Council Social Services team.
