Then all the children and teachers will have a long holiday. This is good. Things I might do when I'm not at school are ...





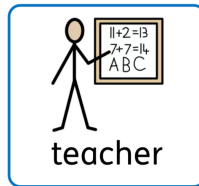
My new teacher / class

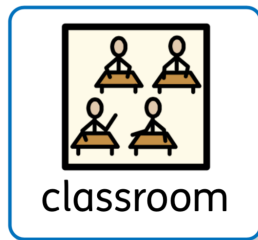
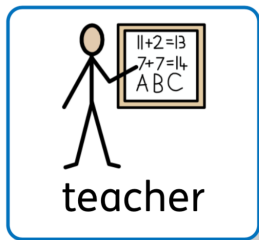
Lots of children feel worried and maybe excited when they are starting something new. It is helpful to remember what you know will be the same as before.
